The project is aimed at promoting a social atmosphere in the parish through farming, heritage, art & craft, sporting events and most importantly – family, in a range of events designed to suit everyone’s tastes & desires. We plan to hold events such as obstacle courses, walking events, heritage cycling events, traditional music, fair days, field events and many more activities throughout the weekend. We also hope to celebrate the Gathering by inviting home families to South Roscommon for the weekend. The aim is to establish a regionally recognised festival in South Roscommon and to promote all aspects the area has to offer. We also hope to create a positive atmosphere for all ages in the community and welcome in tourists to our area by providing suitable events for the before mentioned to take part in. We hope to build on this in years to come and it is hoped that we can attract significant numbers back into the area who may have left in the past generations. We also wish to encourage a sense of pride in South Roscommon once again. We want to have a platform to promote the cultural, recreational & heritage sites in the county as a whole and we believe we are well placed to implement this in the centre of South Roscommon. To achieve the above we are undertaking a training course in order to gain the necessary skills to implement a business plan that will help us become sustainable in the near future. This year we hope to further develop an obstacle course to attract numbers from all across the country to partake and this will be the first obstacle course to be held in Co. Roscommon. If this project is well supported we believe that it could become one of the main events in Roscommon’s tourism calendar for years to come. We are promoting local heritage sites such as cairns, tomb stones, ring forts, mass rock locations, and many more sites such as the church in Cam graveyard. In addition to the above we have a variety of workshops demonstrations and displays taking place over the weekend to suit all ages. As Brideswell Pattern Festival is all about promoting South Roscommon and all it has to offer we feel we are unlikely to compete with any other local events but rather compliment them as we plan to co-operate with other festivals and events within the County in terms of marketing by listing them on our web site and offering them the opportunity to have promotional material available at our festival also

The nearest events are Boyle Arts Festival & O’ Carolan Summer School which have different audiences to ours. One of the main visions of our festival is to “attract additional tourists to South thus boosting the local economy and benefitting primary producers and suppliers”. This is with the added vision of creating a nationally recognised festival in the Northwest of Ireland and an annual celebration for the people of Roscommon and its visitors. On the whole the Festival has a diverse range of attractions which attracts a diverse market audience both in age and location.



We believe that this festival has a massive potential to become one of the biggest festivals in the North West as we are ideally situated just outside Athlone.(The midlands of the country).

The project will raise awareness of all the amenities that are readily available to us in the area. We hope to catch the imagination of the people in the county and give people a growing sense of ownership and pride in what there area has to offer including incorporating its people and also in turn their talents. We are undertaking a training course in order to gain the necessary skills to implement a business plan that will help us become sustainable in the near future. We will add new events and attractions each year and target new markets.

For over 40 years Bealnamulla Handball Club has played a pivotal role in offering an alternative sports and social activity in the area for both young people and adults. Handball was once widely played in the local secondary schools in the Athlone region. There is a renewed interest in Handball in the Country as a social and sporting activity and the Bealnamulla handball alley, as the only 60'x30' alley in South Roscommon, is in prime position to help promote the activity further both from sporting and social point of view. The club has been getting numerous calls from people wishing to join the club but because of the dilapidated nature of the premises, recruiting of new membership by the club has been suspended until the facilities are brought up to safe and acceptable standard.

## Proposed Project

**Description of Proposed Project:** Renovation of existing handball alley at Cloonakilla, Bealnamulla, Athlone.

Whilst the development committee would ideally like to carry out extensive renovations to the facilities to completely modernise the facility, the priority at present is getting the facility back into a state of repair for use by the community and, equally as important, eliminate the very significant health risks that presently exists with the facility due to its dilapidated state. A quote for extensive works has been obtained in the sum of €45,286.50 (see attached quote). However, it has been decided that the cost of removing the back wall and rebuilding it, notwithstanding the preference to do so, is uneconomical as matters stand and therefore other remedial measures such as re-plastering are proposed that will bring the back wall up to an acceptable standard for play. An estimate of costs has been obtained in this respect if this work in the amount of €18,443.00 (see attached quote). Phase 1 of the works to get the facility back in operation has already taken place with the clearing of the road to the facility and the laying of fill on the road to allow vehicular access. Funding is sought in respect of Phase 2 of the project. Included in Phase 2 (along with the proposed construction works) is the legal transfer of ownership of the property which is currently being transferred from the landowner to the Bealnamulla Handball Club. The club currently operates as a community organisation. The Club's solicitors are currently attending to the transfer of the lands (see attached letter). The ownership of the facility will be transferred to the trustees of the club until the club has incorporated as a company. Phase 3 of the project will involved the provision of toilets, shower facilities, electricity and a mains water supply will commence at some time in the near future after the completion of phase 2 of the development. Funding for Phase 2 is critical in order to see the development progress.

**How will the work be carried out?** The bulk of the construction works will be carried out by a contractor. Some of the work, such as painting of walls, will be carried out by volunteers. We have received a commitment of sponsorship from local businesses in respect of some of the materials required such as sand and cement for the plastering works and paint for the walls and floor. The first phase of the project has been completed to date, namely reopening the roadway thus making the facility accessible both on foot and by vehicle and the legal transfer of the property.

**How will this project benefit your local area?**

The facility is currently being accessed by young people in the area. As is evidenced from the graffiti on the building (see photographs attached) significant and unacceptable risks are being taken by young people accessing the premises. The facility has become a haven for anti-social behaviour because of its dilapidated nature. The proposed works would benefit the community by eliminating the risks attached to the premises and at the same time bringing back into use a facility that has for a long time been dormant and thus reduce the incident of anti-social behaviour in the area. The facility is located in very close proximity to Clonakilla National School and the redevelopment of the facility would offer an alternative sporting amenity in an area which already has a deficiency with regard to alternative amenities for young people. The proposed works will make the facility safe by eliminating the hazard and will provide an alternative sports facility for young children and young adults alike. In addition, noting that part of Monksland is a designated area under RAPID funding, the development will help to promote social inclusion in the area by providing a facility that will be open to all the community to use, both young and old.

Standing on the shoulders of giants, the Moore Community Playground Committee is a voluntary group of young parents and community members who saw a gap in their community, undertook research (adults and children), and worked to fundraise in the local area as well as surrounding communities of Drum, Creagh, Athlone, and Ballinasloe. The aim was to create a playground and amenity space for everyone that will be free for everyone to attend and accessible for all.

This new space which will not only be an asset to Moore and Clonfad but also to surrounding areas and to Roscommon as a county leading the way in community accessibility. This will now be a place where everyone can meet, build relationships, get to know each other, get some fresh air, exercise and have fun.

We are applying for assistance to complete Phase 2 of our playground/amenity space project which includes a wheelchair swing, benches, matting, and a sensory garden (photos attached).

1) **The Wheelchair Swing** is an accessible swing for all ages up to a weight of 23 stone. The swing will be situated between another set of swings and a sheltered seating area. We chose this to ensure that those using the wheelchair swing will not feel isolated or separated from others in the playground.

We have secured part funding for the swing but require an additional small sum to cover the cost.

2) **Sensory Garden:** We intend including a specific area for children with special needs, introducing materials, plants, and sensory experiences. This will offer a different opportunity for children and young people with special needs to engage with others on their own terms. It will offer a quiet space for those who need/prefer this to running around the playground and it will also support greater understanding amongst everyone about the different needs of children and adults in our rural community.

3) **Mats:** We have to protect the grass that is currently growing from wear and tear underneath the zipwire. For that, we require 49 environmentally friendly mats that will allow grass to grow through.

4) **Benches:** We are seeking funding to include three benches. One of these will be placed in the sensory garden and will be backless. This will be appropriate for children with autism as they can chose which way they'd like to face. We wish to place a bench in the seated sheltered area where children and adults can sit, relax, chat, and eat. Finally, we wish to insert a bench with a back particularly for older people or parents so they can sit and watch their children/grandchildren.

**How will the work be carried out?**

**Swing:** Murphy's Playground Company will insert the swing and ensure that it meets ROSPA safety standards.

**Sensory Garden:** The Playground Committee together with volunteers with gardening expertise. The local Foroige Youth Club is also involved in designing a centre piece for the sensory garden.

**Benches:** Murphy's Playground Company together with Playground Committee and volunteers will insert the benches and ensure they are securely in place.

**Mats:** Playground Committee will insert these.

We have completed the first phase and now wish to complete phase 2 which includes the wheelchair swing, benches, mats, and sensory garden.

**How will this project benefit your local area?**

While phase 1 of the project concentrated on the development of the playground, phase 2 focuses on areas of specific need so that all children regardless of ability will have a space to play and socialise with their peers. Therefore it was important to consider how children's participation could be promoted through the provision of specific equipment and play spaces. The wheelchair swing chosen by the committee is one that is user friendly and can be managed by a single person. This makes it very accessible to parents visiting the playground on their own with a child in a wheelchair.

The sensory garden will offer a unique space for children.. It will be divided into four key areas. The first will include plant boxes which those visiting the garden can see, smell, touch and taste. The second will be a light and reflection wall piece which will enhance children's awareness of light, shadow and reflection. The third will be a sound wall piece which will allow children's natural exploration of sound, cause and affect to come alive. The final area will be a seated area which will encourage communication and imagination.

It is important to include this area so that children with particular sensory difficulties can have their needs catered for. However, all children learn through their senses and by combining play and sensory experiences in this unique way, we can only promote their health and wellbeing.

As a society we have become more aware of the importance of inclusion for all children and adults. As a committee we feel this must be reflected in all current and future developments for the community. This project, in essence, with its accessible focus, will reduce isolation and social exclusion; enhance mental health and physical well-being; enhance the area and county in terms of available services for communities which are free and accessible to all ages and for meeting different needs. This project will support us to provide a space where all children regardless of ability can go to have fun and be children, playing alongside peers. It will provide an outlet for parents and an additional accessible playground which local communities can benefit from for exercise but also a space where people can come together and socialise.

Through the good will of people in the locality, we fundraised door to door; we bag packed in Athlone and Ballinasloe; we held a massive harvest day (including cow dung bingo); we held a Brendan Shine night in Ballinasloe; we set up an online Idonate account and got donations from Ireland and abroad; we held a Halloween night and we benefited from a drag hunt; we sought donations from local businesses; and got some support from the Parish Priest and Pastoral Council. 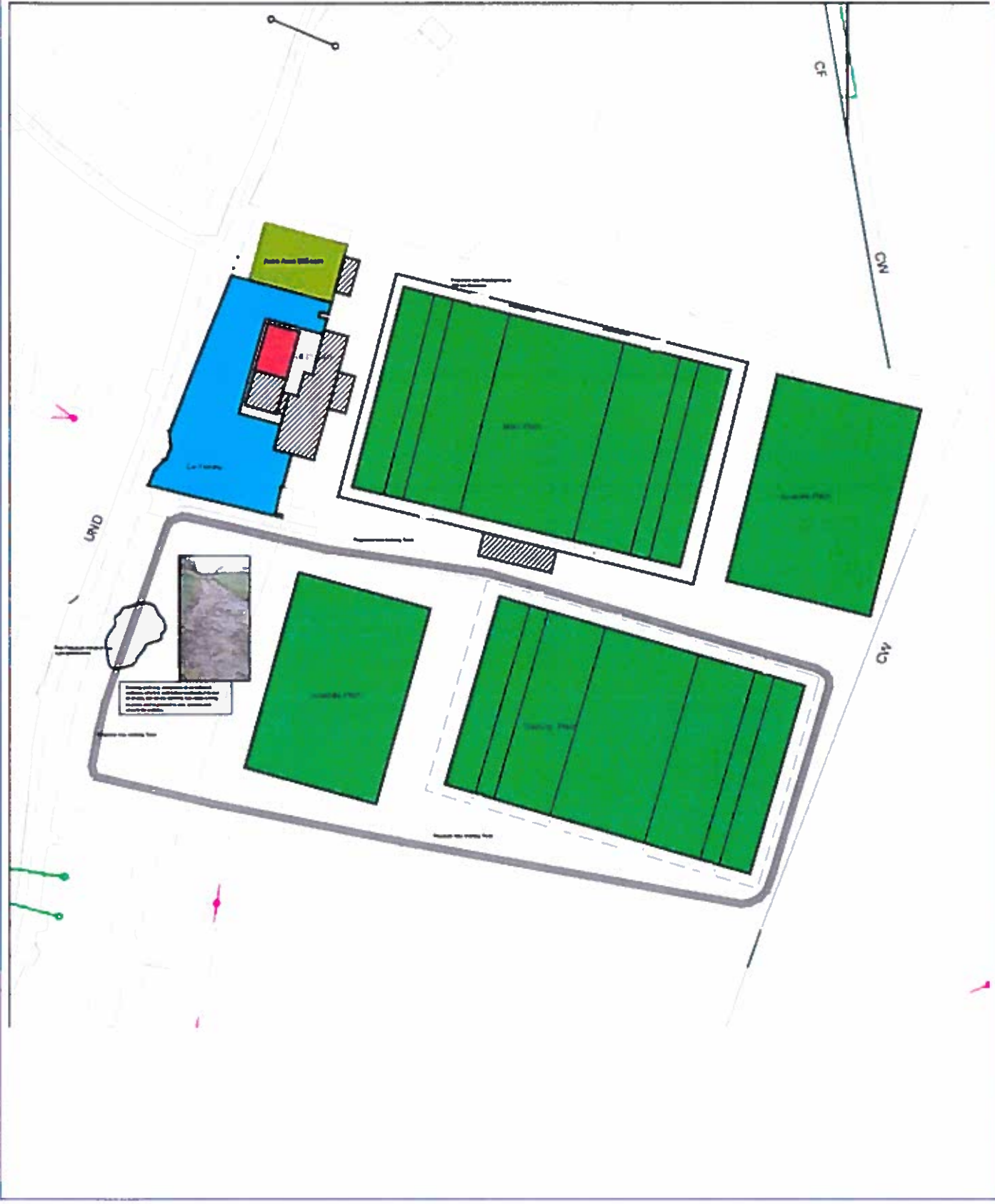

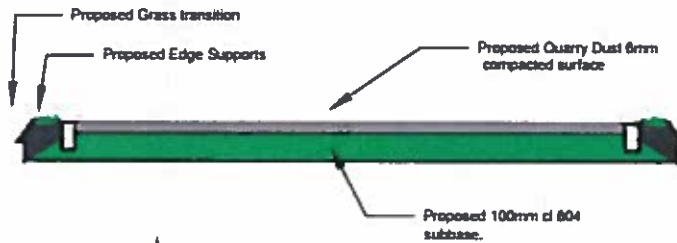

The project involves the removal of a number of internal walls consisting of 3 small rooms. With these walls removed it will allow us to create one large meeting and training room.

The exact work plan will be:

- Demolish and remove 3 existing internal walls to create 1 open plan room (59 sq meters of internal wall).
- Construct concrete block wall (59 square meters (with shatterproof windows) on balcony. The balcony will then be sealed, and secure. This will also improve the acoustics in the main hall which has been a problem when using the stage for concerts and shows.
- Install new window to front of building. 2m wide x 1.5m high
- Install lighting , smoke+ fire alarms+ Install 20 X double sockets @ low level. This will allow for the plugging in of sports machines and computers throughout the new room.
- Install new electric metered heater. All our heaters in the centre are metered, and this insures our running costs remain low.
- Install new fire door @ hallway/staircase. This will be the entrance door to the new room. There is currently no door here.
- Re-plaster damage to walls. There will be some small damage to walls, during the removal of the internal walls.
- Plaster new block partition wall on both sides and repaint.
- Repaint all walls in this new room
- Repair floor where internal walls are dismantled
- Resurface floor with durable timber flooring.

Tisrara Community Centre is an important meeting and training venue for our local traveller community. The kitchen and meeting room are used extensively to provide training in home management as well as social and personal skills for this targeted disadvantaged group.

The facilities in this area of the Centre need urgent attention to be health and safety compliant.

We have discovered that a major restructuring of the ceilings in this section of the Centre needs to be undertaken as a priority and will cost much more than previously estimated.

The sixteen interior doors are not fire proof and need to be replaced. There is no smoke alarm in the building and this is a serious omission in a building that is open for public use.

The heating system needs upgrade and replacement of five wall mounted gas heater units.

We have no option but to address these health and safety issues in the Centre otherwise we will be compelled to restrict the use of the building to a minimum. It is imperative that we upgrade the Centre to be compliant with building and construction standards.

These works can only be undertaken if we are awarded a substantial grant in order to achieve our objective in promoting a positive quality of life for all age groups. We are committed to providing the local contribution but depend on subvention and grant-aid in order to maximise our local financial resources. We rely on your invaluable financial support and hope you will accede favourably to our application for additional grant assistance.
